Case of Thomas H. Dashiels, No. 571.935

On this 12 day of June, 1890, at  
Baltimore, County of City  
 State of MD, before me, J. E. Henry, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared James  
Fredrick, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 42 years of age  
 Residence, 918 N. Eutaw St. this city.

Dealer in second hand material.

Enlisted at Monrovia Frederick Co. Md. was sent  
 to Camp Belger, Balto City, Md. from there  
 to Benedict, Charles Co. Md. when the 19th  
 us. C. T. I was being organized, in 1863. Fall  
 I was assigned to Co. G. in which I served  
 some three years and more. was mustered out  
 at Brownsville Texas, and paid off at Fort  
 Federal Hill, Balto City, Md. July 1867.

First met claimant a little before the  
 30th of July 1864. he was a grenadier.

We were not specially intimate.

After the fight of the 30th of July 1864  
 (Mine explosion) claimant complained  
 of having been trampled on, and hurt in  
 said fight. Know he was sent away

to some hospital and was gone for  
 some time. can't now say how long he  
 was gone. Remember he was cut  
 up, and was lame in his back and legs.  
 his movements indicated this.

Never saw any of his alleged injuries.  
 Know claimant had the scurvy bad  
 in Texas, and that <sup>he complained that</sup> his eyes were very  
 sore at the same time. do not  
 now recall how scurvy affected claimant
