Madam:

Your affidavit filed on the 20th instant for the purpose of having further consideration given your claim for reimbursement in the case of Margaret A. Dashiells, certificate No. 380,293, has been given careful consideration, but it is held that a change of action is not warranted. As set forth in a communication to you dated January 13, 1913, it is shown by evidence on file that you were paid sick and death benefits by certain societies to which the pensioner belonged in the sum of \$116. The charges filed by you which were approved were for medical services, \$2, and the bill of the undertaker, \$79. Your affidavit now sets forth a charge for nursing by yourself of \$16.33, which is also approved, making a total approved charge of \$97.33. The items in your affidavit of three months rent, \$21; loss of time, \$9, and cash for medicine are not approved for the reason that charges for rent and loss of time are not considered proper charges against the accrued pension and there is nothing to show that the cash for medicine was not furnished
