Personally came before me a Deputy
 Clerk of Court Superior in and for the aforesaid
 City and State, Josiah Cornish the Claimant,
 citizen of Baltimore State of Maryland
 reputable and entitled to Credit, and who,
 being duly sworn, declares in relation to the
 aforesaid claim, as follows:

That he was injured about the month of
 April 1866 at ^{the} Fort Totten, near Washington
 D.C. they were engaged in dismounting
 Cannon, that while lifting the handspike
 which he held slipped causing him to fall
 between the wheels and Cannon the weight
 of the Cannon crushing him through the
 breast producing Congestion and hemorrhage
 of the lungs.

That he was attended by Dr. Oden and
 Surgeon Mitchell that he was treated at
 his quarters there being Contagious Diseases
 in the Regimental Hospital, he remained
 under the Care of the above named Physi-
 ans for about one month, when he was
 discharged for disability.
