That he is the Josiah Cornish claimant for Pension, and late of Co D 4th Regt M S C Troops Vol as aforesaid, in Claim No "188.913" and in answer to requirement May 13th 1880 declares that "Cager" and "Jackson" who have testified in this Case were Members of Co D as aforesaid, and were at "Fort Totten" at the time this affiant was injured, of which fact there can be no mistake upon his part, if any mistake it must be by or in report to department, as this Affiant remembers well that Co E was at Fort Lincoln, Co H at Fort Stevenson and Co A at Fort Bunker Hill, Co I & D at Fort Totten, and under Sargent "Cadey" dismantling Fort Totten, this affiant asks that this matter be carefully examined as he can produce further evidence if required to do, and further declares that "Cager & Jackson" were at Fort Totten at the time he was injured as they have stated.

And he further declare that.....no interest in said case and.....not concerned in its prosecution, and.....not related to said applicant.
