ON THIS Eleventh day of September A. D. 1880, personally appeared before me, a
Justice of the Peace in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer
oaths, Josiah Cornish aforesaid, aged about 39 years, a resident of
Baltimore in the County of City of U. S. South Carolina and State
of Maryland, well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit,

For all the years immediately preceding my enlistment into the service of the United States on the 28th
day of July, 1863, I resided in the following-named places: Cambridge

and my occupation was that of a preparer and loading ship timber

Since my discharge from said service on the 4th day of May, 1866, I have resided in
Baltimore City State of Maryland all the time

Since - and never have worked for any "Boss' Employer";
therefore cannot furnish certificate for such; but can
and will furnish the evidence of neighbors & others -

and my occupation has been that of a man of odd jobs when able to work

I further state that the disability for which I claim a pension arises from wound in left arm
by fire shot at Shrapnel trap U. S. Army 18th 1865 while on
Skirmish line. Was sent to Regimental Hospital was
attended by Dr Odeon; Dr Mitchell taken an interest in his
case, and some time after Christmas in 1866 while dismantling
Fort Slocum one of the defences of Washington was mashed between
the wheels of a "cannon" and the breach of one of the cannon & disabled
From my said discharge to the present time, I have received the following medical treatment for said disease injury
first after discharge was treated by Dr Buckler Jones, who resided

at the corner of Broadway & Gough Street, who treated him for injury
of arm and breast, was under him for more than two years & was
totally unable to do any work. Dr Buckler Jones died, and this affair
was attended by Dr Cockrell for his breast and almost for three
total loss of use of left arm; Dr Cockrell resided on Broadway (South)
and since died and has used numerous advertised and other
medicines none of which has done him any permanent good
Since the origin of the disability for which pension is claimed, I have suffered with the following acute diseases:

Disease of the Breast, with severe pain in arm that was
shot to such an extent that he has while trying to white wash
dropped the brush from his hand, and the pains in his breast
and severe coughing has been and is distressing all of which he
for which I was treated by Dr. Buckler Jones & Dr. Cockrell in 1866, 67 & 1868; also
by Dr Cockrell up to the time of his death. He further declare
if there be any difference in his statement, before the "examining
surgeons" and those contained in his previous affidavits
now on file in the pension office, he is not aware, as he has
