On Muster Roll for January and February 1865 he is reported "On daily duty as "bolor Guard".

Records of Events, same Roll shows "January 4th 1865, the Co. with the Regt. started with Genl. Terry's expedition to Wilmington, N. C., + engaged the enemy in several skirmishes at Sugar Loaf Battery Federal Point, N. C., + entered Wilmington N. C. February 22nd, 1865" + +

Company was in action February 11, 1865 at Sugar Loaf N. C.

Company was stationed April 1st, 1866, at Fort Lincoln, D. C.

No evidence of alleged wounds or injury on Co. or Regt. Records on file in this office.
