and entitled to credit, and who being duly sworn, declare in relation to the foregoing case, as follows:

Has known aforesaid Cornish since ~~1866~~ of 1866, and also knew Dr Buckler Jones who is now deceased; and further declares that said Cornish is a very sober quiet man and a good citizen and remembers that "Cornish" aforesaid was a sick man when he came home ¹⁸⁶⁶ was entirely unable to work being compelled to carry his arm against his breast (his left arm) on account of his wound and also knows that he said "Cornish" was treated by Dr Buckler Jones aforesaid for his wounded arm and spitting blood, and has after seen Cornish come out of said Dr Jones office corner of Gauch & Broadway and he further declares that said "Cornish" has never been well since he has been out of the Army, and never able to earn a support for himself and family; and further declares that he knows that after the death of Dr Buckler Jones that the claimant was under the treatment of Dr Joseph M. Cockrell No South Broadway as this affiant has gone with the said claimant to the office of Dr Cockrell for treatment while in a suppurated condition in the year 1876 about October of said year.

And he further declare that.....he has.....no interest in said case, and.....not concerned in its prosecution, and.....is.....not related to said applicant.
