That he is a Plaster and Brick Layer, and his Residence is No 111 Bethel Street aforesaid; and has known the above Josiah Cornish since some months after he came home after his said Cornish discharge from the army May 4 1866. lived neighbours within about three square from each other, and noticed that the said "Cornish" appeared much afflicted ~~and~~ about his breast, and was informed by him that he was injured by being washed between a "Cannon" and the breast of a cannon; while dismantling one of the forts around Washington D.C.; as have known him from said time to the present, and know that during all of said time the said ~~time~~ Cornish has been afflicted, and to all appearance is unable to perform manual labor for the support of himself and family. and that his Cornish's wife does constantly work for a support to the family, and he further declares that the said Josiah Cornish is and has been during all the time of his acquaintance with him an honest sober good citizen, and believes him fully entitled to the pension he asks.
