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trained is the only money you have ever borrowed from E. Johnson,

a. Yes.

q. Why has your check been going to his, Johnson's address and is it not a fact that he has held your pension certificate ever since you had your pension check go there?

a. Yes, he has been holding my pension certificate and my pension check has been going there ever since he has held it. I always have been on hand at E. Johnson's office and got the pension check before he got Johnson got it. I handed it to E. Johnson and he cashed it.

q. Do you know how much you got out of your last pension check?

a. \$41.50 I think I gave my wife \$5

q. Didn't you owe E. Johnson <sup>voucher fees</sup> 25¢ 25¢ for cashing check and 50¢ borrowed money?

a. Yes.

q. Then how do you account for his Johnson giving you \$41.50?

a. I can't.
