Caper, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 48 yrs old.
 Driver. P.O. 1426 Haw Al. This city
 I served in D 4 U.S.C. Inf. with
 Josiah Cornish here present.
 Met him first in the service.
 When he was at Yorktown Va
 in 1862. I can't say the season
 but at this place he complains
 of having the piles. I first heard
 him complain of the piles at
 this place. I saw his piles it
 was protruding. I sometimes
 bumped in his quarters but not
 in his bunk. He was sent to the
 regimental doctor for it. He was
 in hospital once can't say
 when though.
 Clint. had diarrhoea at Yorktown
 Va. I saw him go to the rear and
 he complains of diarrhoea. He has
 diarrhoea first & it turned into
 piles. We were discharged together
 and he complains of piles then
 I have seen him 2 or 3 times
 a week since the war and
 he has complaint of piles.
 I boarded with him four years
 along about '69
