himself did not treat it."

Q "Was it before or after the war that
the swelling came on the neck?"

A "Oh, long before the war."

Q "How long before the war was it the
doctor put the blister on?"

A "Could not say, it was the time those
men were hung. He went to see them hung
and it was his first day out."

Q "How many different times did you
have Dr. Audre to see your husband before
he enlisted?"

A "I suppose, maybe, twice, I think it
was for two spells of sickness, he had a
spell of the bilious there."

Q "Where were you living?"

A "All the sickness he ever had was
there; little house on McElderry Court."

Q "Where was Dr. Audre living then?"

A "On Aisquith St."

Q "Do you wish to be present at the ex-
amination of the witnesses in this case, if so,
you have at sight to do?"

A "I am too poor, and I have to work
too hard, I will try and do the best I can."

Q "Have you ever heard soldier have bad
spells of coughing?"

A "Before the war before he enlisted, he
never coughed, and he had no bad coughing
and further declares that he has no interest, direct or indirect, in the claims
spells afterward, - after he came home, to my rec-
lection" for a pension; and further said not.
