

me That his Lungs was affected and would have to be sent to Hospital and shortly afterwards he was ordered north and I heard not seen no more of Chambers until I saw him at Fort Federal Hill at Baltimore where the Regiment was finally disbanded we both were in Baltimore I saw him and know of him that he was never able to do any work and was completely broken down by the Diseases which he had contracted in the Army I was personally acquainted with him before he enlisted he was then a very healthy strong man the Regiment was discharged from the Army on the 10th day of December 1865 and the said John H. Chambers died on the 21st of January 1867 I have no interest in this claim
