Case of Sophie Chambers, No. 232,482

On this 10th day of February, 1882, at Baltimore, County of Baltimore State of Maryland, before me, A. Curran a Special ~~Agent~~ ^{Examiner} of the Pension Office, personally appeared George Graf, who, being by me duly sworn according to law, declares that his age is 54 years, that he resides at 7th 212 Orleans St. Baltimore Baltimore, State of Maryland, and that he is the same Graf who testified before me in this claim, on January 10th 1882, and now, continuing, deposes further and says —

Q "Do you believe you were so well acquainted with Claimant's husband in 1862, and 1863, that if Dr. Andre, J. Ridgeway, Andre, was during that time, or any part of it, attending him, said husband, for so long a period as several days at a time, and treating him for any disease, you must have known of it?"

A "Well I would not like to say, positively, he was not sick before he enlisted. No, I would not like to say Dr. Andre was not treating him then, Dr. Andre is a attentive physician, he may have treat him and I did not know it, before he Chambers enlisted."

Q "Can you now say, and do you say, that Claimant's husband did not have any disease of lungs, or of his liver, before he enlisted?"

A "I don't believe so, I took him to be a healthy man."

Q "Where were you living in February 1862?"

A "I lived down there Cor Canal & M^{rs} Elding St. that time."

Q "Were you at home regularly during that month, February 1862?"

A "I was, as much as at any time."
