Case of Sophia Chambers, No. 232,482

On this 12th day of January, 1881, at
Baltimore, County of Baltimore
 State of Maryland, before me, Alvangan
 a Special Agent of the Pension Office, personally appeared John H. Scott
 who, being by me duly sworn according to law,
 declares that his age is 50 years, that he resides at 7² 90th Dallas St.,
 County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, and that
 he is a laborer by profession, and being examined
 by me for and on behalf of the claimant in the above
 entitled cause, for answer to the interrogatories
 propounded by me deposes and says, To the first
 interrogatory, "Look upon the paper handed you
 by me, which is marked E/4, and upon this one
 marked E/2, and say whether the signature to each
 purporting to be yours is your genuine signature, and
 whether the contents of each and all of them relating
 to the claim of Sophia Chambers for a pension, is of
 your own knowledge true?"

Answer "Yes, Sir, I signed both those papers,
 But I did ^{not} say he came home from the hospital,
 I said he came home from the Regiment,
 They got that down wrong, I know nothing about
 his coming home from hospital, I know he left
 the Regiment, and I never saw him afterwards
 till he came to the Regiment when we was out
 here on Federal Hill water to be paid off, My
 wife she went to the house that can see him sick
 in his house, But I did ^{not} because I was on the
 Army then and of course could ^{not} see him in his
 own house, I can't say, either that he was sick
 in the Army, I know he came home, on a fur-
 lough and never came back to the Regiment
 no more."
