Case of Sophia Chambers, No. 232,482

On this 18th day of February, 1882 at
Baltimore City, County of J
 State of Maryland, before me, Alurgon
 a Special ^{Ex^r} Agent of the Pension Office, personally appeared J. Ridgway
Quinn, who, being by me duly sworn according to law,
 declares that his age is 57 years, that he resides at 7th 121, Baltimore
 County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, and that
 he is the same person who testified before
 me on the 3^d day of February, 1882, and
 being now again examined by me,
 deposes and says, as follows, to wit:

Q "Doctor, the claimant in this case
 has expressed a wish that I should
 again examine you upon your recol-
 lection as to the immediate cause of death
 of the soldier, and, also, as to the nature
 of the disease for which you treated him
 in Febry, 1862, and in Nov, 1863. Have
 you any thing further to say in the premises?"

A "My recollection don't serve me
 precisely as to my treatment of him in
 1862, but I think it was for some bilious
 trouble - which refers to the liver; as to the
 death cause it was as stated heretofore
 by me - congestion of lungs and liver."

Q "Do you recollect your treatment
 of him in 1862?"

A "I do not"

Q "It has been stated that you once
 before the war treated him by plaster
 application on his back. Have you any
 recollection of that, or of any occasion
 when you attended him for cramps?"

A "I don't recollect"
