Case of Sophia Chambers, No. 232,482

On this 13th day of February, 1882, at
Baltimore, County of Baltimore
 State of Maryland, before me, A. Morgan
 a Special Agent of the Pension Office, personally appeared Balthasar
Gulau, who, being by me duly sworn according to law,
 declares that his age is 74 years, that he resides at No. 135 Canal St.
Baltimore City, County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, and that
 he is a tailor by trade and being examined
 by me he deposes and says as follows, to-wit:

Q "Please state whether you know one Sophia
Chambers, also whether, in his life time, you knew
 one John H. Chambers, and, if so, state how long
 you have known each said person?"

A "Yes, I know John Chambers and I know his
 widow, Sophia. I knew Mr. Chambers before he
 went in the army, and I saw him in the camp.
 I knew him for about six years before he went to
 war."

Q "Please state whether you know the Regt. in
 which said Chambers enlisted?"

A "I don't know, I know he was in the army, I
 saw him in the camp. He went for a soldier."

Q "Where did you live in 1860, 1861, 1862, 1863,
 1864, 1865 & 1866?"

A "I live all the time right here. It was one
 time No. 143. it is now No. 135 Canal St. I live thirty
 five years right here & down this house."

Q "Where did the Claimant and her husband
 live during that time?"

A "On W. Elderry Court, in rear of my house,
 I think the number is No. 3."

Q "Was John H. Chambers the Claimant's Sophia
Chambers' husband?"

A "So far I know I was not by the wedding.
 He called her wife and she called him husband."
