On this 23^d day of February, 1882, at Baltimore City, County of ... State of Maryland, before me, A. Morgan, a Special Agent of the Pension Office, personally appeared Mrs Emily Johnson, who, being by me duly sworn according to law,

declares that her age is 40 years, that she resides at No. 16. Mott St. County of Baltimore City, State of Maryland, and that she is a widow, and, being examined by me, she deposes and says as follows, to wit:
