

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a Clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk.

On this 21st day of April, A. D., one thousand ^{nine} ~~eight~~ hundred and ~~ninety~~ four, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the

County and State aforesaid, Josephine A. Kell, aged about 51 years, a

resident of 424 Lewis Street, County of Baltimore, State of

Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of

Henry Kell, who enlisted under the name of

Henry Kell, on the 11 day of August A. D.

1863, as a Private in Company "E", in the 4th Regiment of

U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, and served at least ninety days in the late War

of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED May 12th 1865

, and died April 13th 1904. That he was not employed in

the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That he was never employed in the military or naval service of the United States after the 12th

day of May, 1865. That she was married under the name of

Josephine A. Locke to said Henry Kell, on about

the Middle of April A. D. 1869, by Rev. Mr. Johnson

at Black Water, Md., there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had not

been previously married; that her said husband had not been previously married. (4) former marriage

of claimant, and former marriage of soldier dissolved by death

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Henry Kell

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor. That the names and dates of birth of all the

children of the soldier, now living, and under sixteen years of age, are as follows:

That she has not abandoned the support of any one of her children, but that they are still under her care or

maintenance. That no prior application for pension has been filed by herself ^{but} or the soldier under a

pensioner under Cert. No. 49335 General Law

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under

the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

Geo. W. H. Vernon of 106 E. Saratoga St. Baltimore

her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, the fee to be TEN DOLLARS, payable as prescribed by law
