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And I saw him almost daily. He  
 was very sickly then and was only able  
 to creep about a little and was  
 confined to the house much of the time.  
 He had his head bound up very often  
 and complained of his head and of  
 his back, and walked with a stick  
 very often. Sometimes a doctor would  
 be there, I think, but I never saw him  
 and only heard so from my wife. She  
 called him a doctor if all I know.  
 After he moved from the same house I  
 did not see him so often, but  
 generally from every week to every month  
 or such a matter each year since.  
 He would be complaining of his  
 head and back at such times as  
 I saw him, but was so as to be  
 around. I have no knowledge of his  
 doing any work since he came  
 home from the Army, but I do not  
 know why, only he would say he was  
 suffering from his old Army disease.  
 I do not know of his being confined  
 to the house by sickness only at the  
 time and to the extent I have told  
 you and do not know of his being  
 sick from any cause save as I have  
 told you. I have no knowledge or  
 information of his being injured  
 in any manner before or since  
 his Army service. I could not  
 say to what extent a claimant  
 has been disabled for manual  
 labor each year since discharge  
 by complaints of his head and  
 back. I signed Affidavit dated  
 August 29, 1883, and bearing  
 my signature. I am not
