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able to get there. He was Superintendent of the Sunday School. All I know of the cause is that when he was absent the next time he came he would say that he had been kept away on account of the pain in his head and back. Sometimes I went to his house and saw him and at some of these visits he would be in bed while at others he would be sitting up. His head was not tied up but he complained of his head and back at these times. I have visited him at his house several times each year when he was sick from the causes I have named, but I could not say just how often, but sometimes twice a month. I could not say how long at a time he would be sick from this cause. I have been Superintendent of the same Sunday School and assistant for about 45 years and have been assistant while claimant was Superintendent and in this way am able to recall the fact of his absence and the times he was complained. I have no knowledge or information of the claimant being sick or complaining in any manner save as I have stated to you and do not know of his being injured in any way before or since this any service. I do not know of his being treated by a doctor for any cause at any time. In my opinion the claimant has been disabled for the performance of manual labor at least one half the time each year since discharge from work of complaints of his head and back.
