On this 12 day of Sept, 1887, at
Baltimore, County of _____
 State of Maryland, before me, Henry A. Reed, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Dr. John
M. Creek, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says: My name is John

W. Creek, My age is 62 years, residing
 and post office address 337 North
Street, Baltimore, Maryland. and
 I am a physician and surgeon
 having graduated from the Eclectic
 Medical College of Philadelphia and
 been in practice since 1861, during
 which time I have resided in this
 city. I have known James W.
Pinckney the claimant 25 or 30
 years at this city. I was his family
 physician before he enlisted and treated
 his family. I treated him claimant
 one or two times or three years before
 he enlisted for an attack of biliousness
 He was not confined to the bed at that
 time. He complained at this time of
 his head being a little out of order,
 but that was due to the stomach
 which was disorganized. He also
 complained a little of his back about
 the kidneys and legs, but that all
 passed off as soon as his stomach was
 cleared up. Sometimes he complained of
 a headache and I gave him a
 sedative powder and that cleared him
