Driver, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: My name is Moses

Driver, my age is 42 years, residing  
and post office address 213 York  
Street, Baltimore, Maryland, Md and  
I am a laborer. I have resided  
in the city since 1867. I was a  
private in Co. B. 19<sup>th</sup> Regt U.S. Col. 1  
from April 1864 until 1867. I was  
in Camp Butler this April 1864.  
The draft to recruit for the service  
had been sent out when I went in  
Camp, but I remember when it  
returned we had a man in the  
Company by the name of James Prindney,  
but I think he came from the Eastern  
Shore. I do not recall the claimant  
now present as the man I know by  
that name or remember ever seeing  
him until this morning. I know nothing  
of the Prindney I know by sight or disability  
in any manner in the service. I  
am not related to the claimant. I  
fully understand and comprehend  
the questions asked me and my  
answers have been candidly read  
aloud.
