Wille, Winchester, Alexandria Va. and  
 from there we went to Ballinora. We  
 were recruiting, going from here to Hopps  
 Ferry by rail road, but from there around  
 to Alexandria Va on foot. This  
 occupied probably two weeks. The  
 Quartermaster was with the Company during  
 this time. He was not sick and did  
 not complain in any way during  
 this march.

After returning we remained in camp  
 a few days and then went to Annapolis  
 Md by boat. We remained at Annapolis  
 but a few hours and then March to  
 Washington D.C. and remained during this  
 march I was detailed as Commissary  
 Sergeant and did not see so much of the  
 Quartermaster after this. Quartermaster was  
 with the Company at Annapolis and  
 stayed on the march to Washington  
 but I did not see him after I was  
 Commissary Sergeant. I think we reached  
 Washington the evening of the second  
 day after leaving Annapolis. The  
 Quartermaster had not been sick and had  
 not complained of his back, head or  
 kidneys or in any way up to the time  
 I was Commissary Sergeant. I really think he  
 was on duty with the Company for the  
 time he enlisted until the time I have
