how much of the time he was off duty I would not swear to any specific complaint, though no doubt I have heard him say what was the matter with him. I cannot now recall that he complained of his head or of being dizzy or of his back or in any specific manner. I have no knowledge of his being injured in any way during my acquaintance with him. I never regarded him as being very weak or as requiring special physical strength. The duty he was employed upon was very light, being that of cleaning up and discharging the duties of a messenger. I fully understand and comprehend the questions asked me and my answers have been candidly recorded.
