In response to Departmental call dated May 4th 1886, for a report upon this appeal, I have the honor to state as follows:-

In declaration filed June 28th 1880, the appellant alleges that while at Annapolis, Md. in April 1864, from exposure he contracted Typhoid fever, from the effects of which he has never entirely recovered. He also claims that the fever resulted in weakness of his spine in the lumbar region, something resembling lumbago, and it also affected his head.

The Adjutant General, U. S. A. reports enrollment March 31st 1864, and absent sick in General Hospital since April 22nd 1864, and mustered out May 25, 1865, a patient in McKims' Hospital.
