

SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

To be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. The official character and signature of any such officer not required by law to use a seal must be certified by the clerk of the proper court, giving dates, of beginning and close of official term. If certificate on file, so state.

State of Penn, County of Phila, ss:

On this 24 day of Sept, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety 7 personally appeared before me, a Notary Public

within and for the County and State aforesaid, Cornelius Bowers

aged 34 years, a resident of the City of Phila

County of Phila, State of Penn, who, being

duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Cornelius Bowers

who was ENROLLED on the month day of June, 1863, in Co. B.

39th U. S. Colored Infantry - Private and regiment, if in the Army, or vessel, if in the Navy.

in the service of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days,

and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Baltimore Md., on the 16 day of December, 1865.

That he was disabled for earning a support by manual labor in a pensionable degree on 18 the date of filing his original declaration, by reason of the following disabilities:

Disease of spine kidneys liver and heart rheumatism Deafness
vision - Seafness - affection of lungs - and general debility
That he is also disabled for earning a support by ...

Here state all disabilities incurred since filing your Original Declaration and any which you failed to allege in same.

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, of a permanent character, and that he is now wholly disabled for earning a support by manual labor in consequence

of same. That he has ... applied for pension No. 836.476 under Act June

27. 1890 That he is not a pensioner under Certificate No. ...

under ... State which law That he has not been employed

in the military or naval service of the United States prior to June 1863

or subsequent to December 16. 1865 That he makes this declaration for the purpose of reopening his claim and being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. He also requests that his original or first claim filed under the said act, be re-examined and considered under the provision of the Act approved March 6, 1896, and also under the decision of the Hon. Assistant Secretary of the Interior, of June 17, 1896, in the case of James J. Durkee, Vol. 8. P. D., p. 152, giving construction to said Act, and that he be given an opportunity to show by evidence that his claim, if allowed, should date back to the time of filing his original or first application for pension, under the Act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation

his true and lawful attorney, to prosecute his claim.
