 the applicant, and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be, and that they
 have no interest in the prosecution of this claim. And they further swear that they were well acquainted with her and her
 husband before he entered the service, and know that they lived together as man and wife, and such was their reputation;

that she has remained a widow ever since the death of the said Samuel Truisty Name of Soldier.
 and is now a widow. That the above-mentioned claimant has not in any way been engaged in, or aided or abetted the
 rebellion, but has always been true and loyal to the Government of the United States. That they are able to state the
 foregoing facts from the following circumstances: from a personal acquaintance of

over fifteen years, and that the aforesaid Sydia Ann Truisty
was present and saw the marriage ceremony, between Samuel
Truisty and Elizabeth Peters, performed by the Rev. Phillip Scott
a Methodist Episcopal minister, and pastor of the Sharp St. Church
on the 29th day of May, 1856.

That the names and ages of the children of Mrs. Elizabeth Truisty under sixteen years of age
 at her husband's decease, and the place of their residence, is as follows: Samuel Thomas Truisty,
aged (9) years, Frances Amelia Truisty, aged (7) years, and
Emanuel Truisty, aged (5) years. Samuel was born on the 14th
of April, 1852, Frances Amelia, on the 29th of May, 1859, and Emanuel on
the 21st of April, 1861.
