On this 20 day of July, 1906, at
Baltimore, county of _____
 State of Md, before me, Edw. C. Breckinridge, a
 Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared
Mauritta Pitney, who, being by me first duly sworn to
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 50 odd years old. My p.o. address
 2 is 874 Bradley St Baltimore, Md.
 3 Laundry occupation a laundress.
 4 I know Charlotte Johnson this
 5 claimant and have known her
 6 over 40 years. We were partly
 7 raised together. We are first cousins.
 8 I have no interest in this pension
 9 claim. I saw claimant frequently
 10 while she lived here in Baltimore
 11 before she married Isaac Johnson
 12 thirty odd years ago while my
 13 father was living. Claimant lived
 14 in the house with us and then
 15 she went out to service and
 16 afterwards married Isaac Johnson
 17 but I saw her frequently and
 18 was intimately associated with
 19 her before she married Isaac Johnson
 20 all along and know that she
 21 was never married before she
 22 married Isaac Johnson. Now
 23 she never lived with or cohabited
 24 with any man named Wilson
 25 before she married Isaac Johnson
 26 that I ever knew or heard of. Being
 27 informed of claimant's statement
 28 that she cohabited with a man named
 29 John Wilson before she married
