Jacob Johnson, who, being by me first duly sworn to

 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 65 years old. My p.o.

 3 Baltimore, Md. I am by occupation
 4 janitor.
 5 I am a brother of Isaac Johnson late
 6 husband of Charlotte Johnson the
 7 claimant. I was raised with my said
 8 brother and we both served in the army
 9 but in different regiments. He served in the
 10 7th US Inf and I served in the 30th US Inf.
 11 For 34 years I have lived here
 12 in Baltimore. My said brother Isaac
 13 Johnson was never married before.
 14 He married Charlotte the claimant
 15 that I never knew or heard of.
 16 I asked about the woman Mary Johnson
 17 that my said brother is said to have lived
 18 with before he married again and
 19 I will say I never saw her and never
 20 heard about her. I have heard that
 21 he lived with a woman for a short
 22 time before he married Charlotte but
 23 I never heard any claim made
 24 on the part of any one that he was ever
 25 married to the woman. He never
 26 had any woman at all after
 27 I came to Baltimore that I ever
 28 knew or heard of, and it is
