

DEPOSITION *F*Case of Charlotte Johnson, No. 838960

On this 18 day of July, 1906, at
Baltimore, county of Jeff,
 State of Md, before me, Scott Brutchfield, a
 Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared
John Mason, who, being by me first duly sworn to
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 59 years old. My present address
 2 is 721 East St. Baltimore, Md.
 3 I am by occupation a joiner.
 4 I knew Isaac Johnson in his life-
 5 time and had known him since
 6 the year 1863. I served in 639
 7 and he served in Co. H. of the 7 U.S.C.
 8 I have been well acquainted
 9 with him ever since the war.
 10 We have both lived here in
 11 Baltimore and for a good
 12 many years but for apart.
 13 I am though not acquainted
 14 with Charlotte Johnson his widow.
 15 Asked whether Isaac Johnson
 16 was ever married before he
 17 married Charlotte Johnson this
 18 claimant I will say I don't
 19 know. While I knew him
 20 very well I did not visit
 21 his house and he never
 22 that I recall spoke of his
 23 marital relations. My impression
 24 is that for a number of years after
 25 the war he was not a married
 26 man but just how many I can't
 27 say. No sir I never knew or
 28 heard of his having a wife named
 29 Mary Mason or that he even lived
