On this 14 day of June, 1906, at

 State of Md, before me, Geo. A. Brutchfield, a

Ida Matthews, who, being by me first duly sworn to
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 45 years old. My p.o. address

 3 Md. I am by occupation a cook.
 4 I know Charlotte Johnson this
 5 claimant and have known
 6 her over 30 years. I knew
 7 her for about four years
 8 before she married Isaac Johnson
 9 She then was called Lottie
 10 but I forget what her other name
 11 was. I don't remember whether
 12 it was Tillman or not or whether
 13 it was Wilson or not. I just called
 14 her Lottie and never thought about
 15 her other name. She was never
 16 married before she married Isaac
 17 Johnson but I never heard of
 18 her ever even living or heard of
 19 her cohabiting with any man before
 20 she married Isaac Johnson. She
 21 did anything like that she kept it
 22 secret from me for I know nothing
 23 about it and heard no talk of
 24 it. Asked about John Wilson I will
 25 say I never knew or heard of
 26 her living or cohabiting with such
 27 a person before she married Johnson
 28 and certainly never heard that she
 29 ever married any man of that name.
