Charlotte L. Johnson, who, being by me first duly sworn to
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am 40 odd years old but I do not know my exact age.

My present address is 653 1/2 Sterling St Baltimore Md.

I am by occupation a cook.
I am the identical Charlotte L. Johnson who has made application for pension as the widow of Isaac Johnson who served during the Civil War in Co. D. 74th Ill. He was a pensioner for about nine years before he died.

He never served in any other company or regiment that I ever knew or heard of.

I am unable to give the dates of his enlistment or discharge from memory but I have his original discharge certificate at home which I will show to you if necessary.

I got acquainted with said Isaac Johnson about three years before I married him and I married him here in Baltimore Md on June 7, 1875. I was married at the house of my sister Adalwell by Rev. J. Calvin Allen now dead
