He died upon my marriage to Nathan Johnson. I lived with each husband till they died. Was never divorced from either.

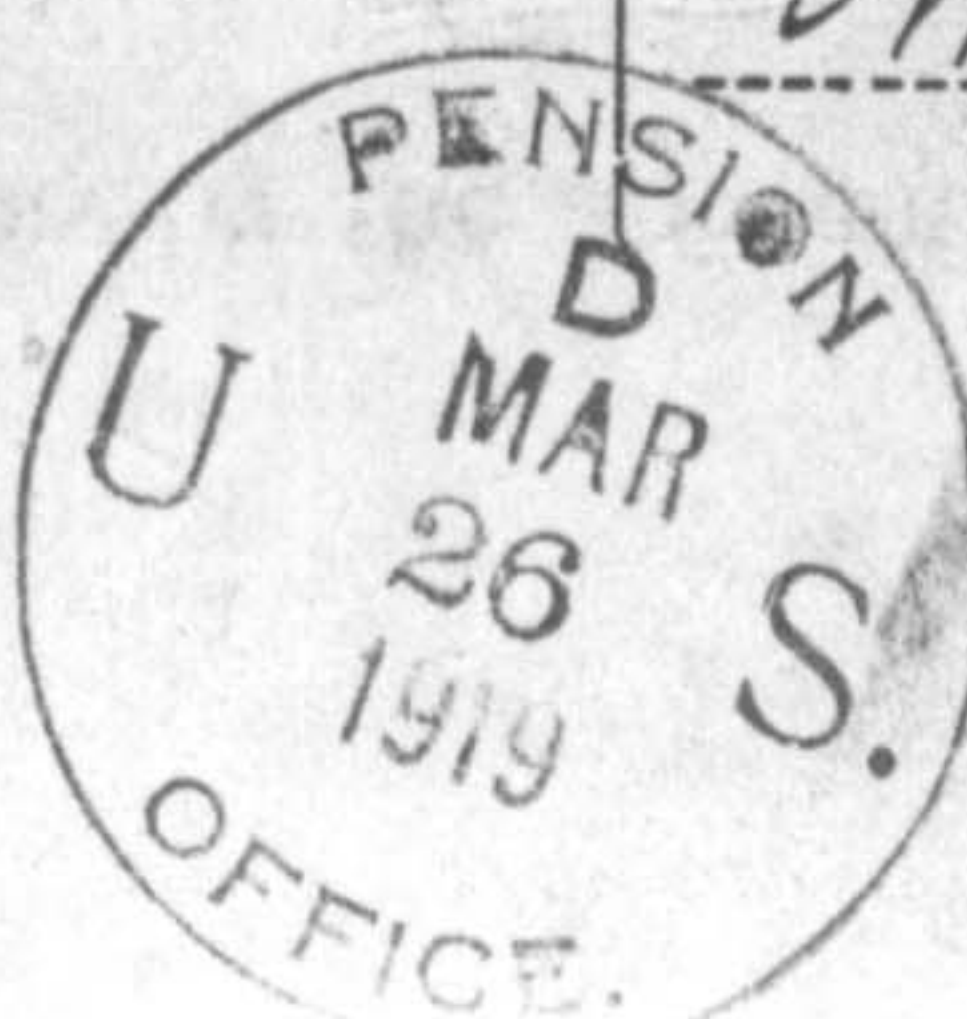
