On this 11 day of Sept, 1895, at
Baltimore, County of Cal.
 State of Md., before me, G. B. Hamerly, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared J. A. Giller
 who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 54 years of age.

Physician and have been practicing in
 this city for the last 25 years.
 My city address is 437 W. Biddle.
 I have known of this Claim since 1882,
 my first professional treatment to him
 was July 1882. I then gave treatment
 for some rheumatic trouble, as I now
 remember. I do remember that he
 complained then of pains of back in
 the region of the spine, and his statement
 as to causes was that he was injured
 at one time while in service by the
 falling of a log. I never found
 anything to indicate that he was
 injured. I found a soreness and tenderness
 on pressure in the lumbar region, and I
 gave treatment for rheumatism. His first
 sickness was of short duration. I treated
 him again at various times from
 1882 to 1890, but can't give dates, or
 exact nature of treatment. I think
 I treated him for malaria on more than
 one occasion, but his principal trouble
 seemed to be pains of back, which I
 considered rheumatism. Yes, my
