DEPOSITION CCase of Nathan Johnson, No. 564795

On this 31 day of Aug, 1895, at
Baltimore, County of City
 State of Md, before me, G B. Haulet, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Isaac
Johnson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says. I am 55 years of age. No

occupation, as I am totally blind. reside
and my City address is 615 Enoch St.
Baltimore Md.

I was priv. Co. "D" 7th U. S. C. T. from
Sept, 1863 to the fall of 1866.

This Clint, is my brother and was in the
same Co, & regt, with me. we enlisted
on the same day and was mustered out
of service the same day. Our service
was the same except he was detailed in
the recruiting service for the first 2 or 3
months after date of enlistment. also was
a prisoner of war in Libby prison at
Richmond Va & in some prison at
Salisbury N.C. He was captured during
the engagement at Fort Gilmore Va, Sept,
29, 1864. I cant say exactly how long
he was a prisoner but would judge
that it was some 6 or 8 months.

He rejoined The Co, & regt, after the fall of
Richmond Va, And just previous to our
leaving Va, for Texas, I cant give dates.
I think now I made a mistake he did
not rejoin us till after we reached
Texas. I cant say how long we had been
in Texas when he rejoined us. It was about
the middle of the summer season 1865 that we

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
