

went to Texas. Yes a number of our regt, & Co were Captured with Clint, at Fort Gilmore Capt McCarly, John Bennett and Gilbert Adams of my Co, were Captured with Clint.

Q Was your brother (this Clint) injured or wounded during his service?

A Yes. Sometime during the winter of 1863-4 about Jan'y 1864 he wrenched his back while carrying logs to build winter quarters at Camp Bendelick Md. No I did not see him hurt. I was informed by some of the boys that he had hurt himself ~~that~~ I know in a day or so after I heard of it I met him & he was complaining of his back and he then informed me that while he & a comrade were carrying the log on their shoulders that his comrade let his end of the log fall and that it hurt his back. No, I can't say who the comrade was. He did tell me but I can't now think of his name. No, I don't think he was treated for his back, but I am sure he complained thereafter of pains in his back, just across his kidneys. Yes, he was at times off duty by reason of these pains in back. I can't say when that was. I understood from him that while he was in prison his feet were frost bitten, and that he had hurt his back again while in prison I think while in prison (Libby).
