

work that day, I understood he went to the Camp, No, he did not work any more that day, No, he did not chop any that day, No, I can't say who was carrying the other end of the log at the time, the log was about 25 feet long & was a good size log I can't say how large a round it was but think it was about the size of that water cooler, (3 feet around) Yes, we were on a regular detail, Tim, Robt Spennett of Co, D, was in charge of detail Robt Riley & this Clute's brother Isaac Johnson with Clute, are all that I now remember who were on that detail, No sir, I did not see his injury only know that he then complained of his injury can't say that he described how he was injured other than his back, Yes, on several occasions in service after date of his injury he spoke to me of pains in his back, No, I can't give dates, No, I can't say if he was at hospital I know at one time he was from the Co, I think he was then a prisoner of war, No, I can't say as to his exact physical condition at discharge, I do know that ever since date of his discharge he has complained of pains of his back No, I never knew or heard of him being injured while a prisoner of war his only injury known to me is as stated herein, I have understood your questions & my answers have been properly recorded
