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Yes, I was with my Co, most of my term of service except soon after enlistment I was detached & on recruiting service for 2 or 3 months, in the Spring of 1864 I was detached and done guard duty at Genl. Burneys headquarters Beaupont S.C. for a short time, about 6 weeks. ~~And~~ And my next absence from Co, was in the fall of 1864 when I was Captured by the enemy at Fort Gilmore Va. I was in Rebel prisons, Libby, (Richmond Va) & the Bull Pen Salisbury N.C. for something over 6 months, I then went to New Camp hospital at Fortress Monroe Va and was there for several months, when I got better and was sent to my regt at Texas.

The only disability of mine in service was this injury to my back, which I first had at Benedict Md. while in Camp. Sometime during the winter of 1863-4 we lay at Camp, Benedict Md without winter quarters and about Jan'y 1864 I, with a number of others from my Co, were detailed to build quarters, and while carrying logs to build said quarters I hurt my back myself and another Comrade of my Co, but whose name I can't say, were carrying a log of 16 or 17 feet long, "it was a small tree", and my Comrade let his end of the log drop, causing a wrench of my back, which wrench produced a pain in the small of my back, I did not carry any more logs, I was in pain for a while that day but got able to take an ax & do some chopping that day. No I did not go to hospital or receive treatment for that injury, Yes, I Complain of it, but can't say to who. Yes it was a regular detail to build the quarter there was several of
