I served as 2 Lt in Co D
7th U.S. Col. Troops from March
1864 to March 1865
I was taken prisoner with a
number of my company in Sept.
29, 1864 taken to Libby Prison then
to "Hog Pen" Salisbury N.C.
then to Danville Va. thence to
Libby and paroled July 21
1865 and returned to Regiment.

I can recall Nathan Johnson
in my Co D, he was a black
man, about 5 ft 9" ind, spare
man, not very plucky, don't know
his age, probably about 21, 4 or
5 I think he came from
Eastern Shore Md

As there was more than
one Johnson in my company
how many I do not recall.

The personal description
given by you (Spec. Aug 9/93) quite
fits Nathan Johnson as
