

I don't know whether he had a brother in the company or not I can't recall him.

Q Did Nathan Johnson suffer from any wound injury or disease while in the service?

A Not that I remember.

Q Did he injure his back in any way?

A Not that I am aware of.

"I suppose he claims he hurt his back by lifting logs like the rest of the boys."

A No, sir. I was not at Benedict Mch. 1863 and 64 near there.

I was in prison at the same time with Sgt. Whittington, Cor Wallace, Alex Johnson, Cooper Allen and Lane but I don't recall Johnson (Nathan) being there. I was in separate quarters in the Libby Prison and all these boys were captured with me. If Johnson (Nathan) was not killed, and in duty he must have been taken prisoner for none of the boys escaped.

I have heard you read the deposition of claimant and it does not refresh my memory. Not related not interested and correctly recorded.
