Ralphs Wharf County of *Queen Anne*
 State of *Maryland* before me, *Joseph Stewes*, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *John*
Bennett, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: My full name is *John Bennett*

age *17*, occupation *farmer*, present
 address *Ralphs Wharf, Queen*
Anne Co., Maryland. Served
 as Corporal Co "H" 11th U.S. Cal
 Infantry. Witness exhibits his
 Certificate of discharge which reads
 "his enlistment" 29th September
 "1863 and discharged June
 "22nd 1865 at Fort Monroe, Md."

Examiner: You were acquainted
 with *Nathan Johnson* (the claimant)
 who was a member of my com-
 -pany and got killed in the
 war and in service. *Nathan*
 was a young and hearty
 fellow and I was tried to
 recollect something that
 acted him out. I did not see
 him but have got something
 that matters to him after
 he went to Texas. I was not
 with them then I had been
 a prisoner and was then
 at the hospital from which
 I was discharged and I
 did not go to Texas with them
