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in town. That was a good while ago. I believe he did go to preaching after the tower. He had his brother in service in our company named James Johnson. They were from Dorchester, Maryland. When our company mustered out Johnson appeared. He all right as far as I could tell as can be seen by. I don't know but of his having any hurt while at Benedict. I don't recollect of his getting hurt there. I do remember of their carrying logs there & buried the negroes. I don't recollect of his complaining of his back at Benedict or afterward. I was tenting with him at Benedict & of us. I slept together. George Thompson said I don't know who of the other one was hurt. One was Aaron Carr (dead I think.) I think Isaac Johnson did also. He changed around a good deal. I was not with the company in front of Richmond but I was at Fort Harrison. I don't recollect of his being in the hospital at anytime. I remember of his going to get treated at Benedict for one place I don't know what got about. I don't recollect of his being in the hospital at anytime. The claim -
