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on Ballintra pretty much ever since
I claim a pension on sunstroke
vertigo rheumatism and I got hurt
across the back in the train at Brown-
sville Texas.

I was sunstruck driving train at-
Brownsville Texas. about first of July
1865. I was treated for it by the Regt-
lry. I dont remember his name now.
first treated in quarters. The vertigo
came on me directly after the sunstroke
at Brownsville. It was the sunstroke
brought it on I think. I get blind like
and a blue skin or smoke stands
in front of me. I stay maybe for
half a day. and if I am up on any
thing I have to get down on the ground.

I just felt the rheumatism a little
bit before I came from the service.
and it has got worse since it
commenced at the top of my back
across my shoulders.

Mr Lloyd has been my atty at
all times for my pension claim. His
office is at Cor Saratoga St St Paul St.

When I first commenced for pension
my office was on Lexington St near
Charles. I think that is near about
5 years ago. I went up to Mr Lloyd
to see him about it. and as witness
for me Mr Lloyd - Peter Mitchell and
I think he took my claim same day.

Peter Mitchell was a witness that
I was in the Co. I think I and Mitchell
went over to the Court on St Paul St
to be sworn I dont think there was
any one along only Mitchell and
myself
