 casually ever since the war out-
 never have worked with him since
 the war. I have been to his house
 when he lived on far Hely where he
 lost his first eye.

I heard John complain some years
 ago about a whirly gig in his head -
 said he got blind and staggered
 said it was from a sun stroke but
 I don't know any thing about how
 or when or where he got the sun stroke
 only what he has told me

It has been 6 or 7 years I have
 heard him complaining about his
 head and he said it came
 from the army. It was very warm
