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saw him prior to the beginning of that year and in fact I only saw him a few weeks prior to the making of my said affidavit. I found him suffering from vertigo the result of hypertrophy of the heart and an obscure disease of the spinal cord probably Duchenne's disease. From the fact that he was subject to vertigo I judged that he was not able to follow his trade as caulker at that time. I have no record of my treatment or of dates thereof - I simply treated him and gave my testimony as to his condition for humanity's sake. I have no recollection of his symptoms or as to his physical condition other than as embodied in my original affidavit and as stated herein. My answers are correctly recorded herein.
