then lived in Philadelphia about a year or two &
then came back & lived on Long Dock Baltimore up to
1874 then to 75 Watson St up to 1877 then to ~~Stricker~~ ^{Bethel} St
near Mulliken up to 1879 then Mulliken St. on
which St I have resided ever since. My disease
came on me near Newbern N.C. Summer of 1865 and
were disease of nerves and diarrhoea & Piles. My nervous
affection causes me to have chronic dizziness &
weakens my arms & legs and I also then had
Rheumatism at Newbern & have suffered from
it ever since. I have done no heavy manual
labor since my discharge and have worked at
light jobs of labor, which I have been able to
pick up from time to time.
I have been treated by Dr Moffit & Hunt
& a German Doctor who treated me when I
first came ^{home}, whose name I think was Heck
is now dead. I have been too poor to
have constant treatment
