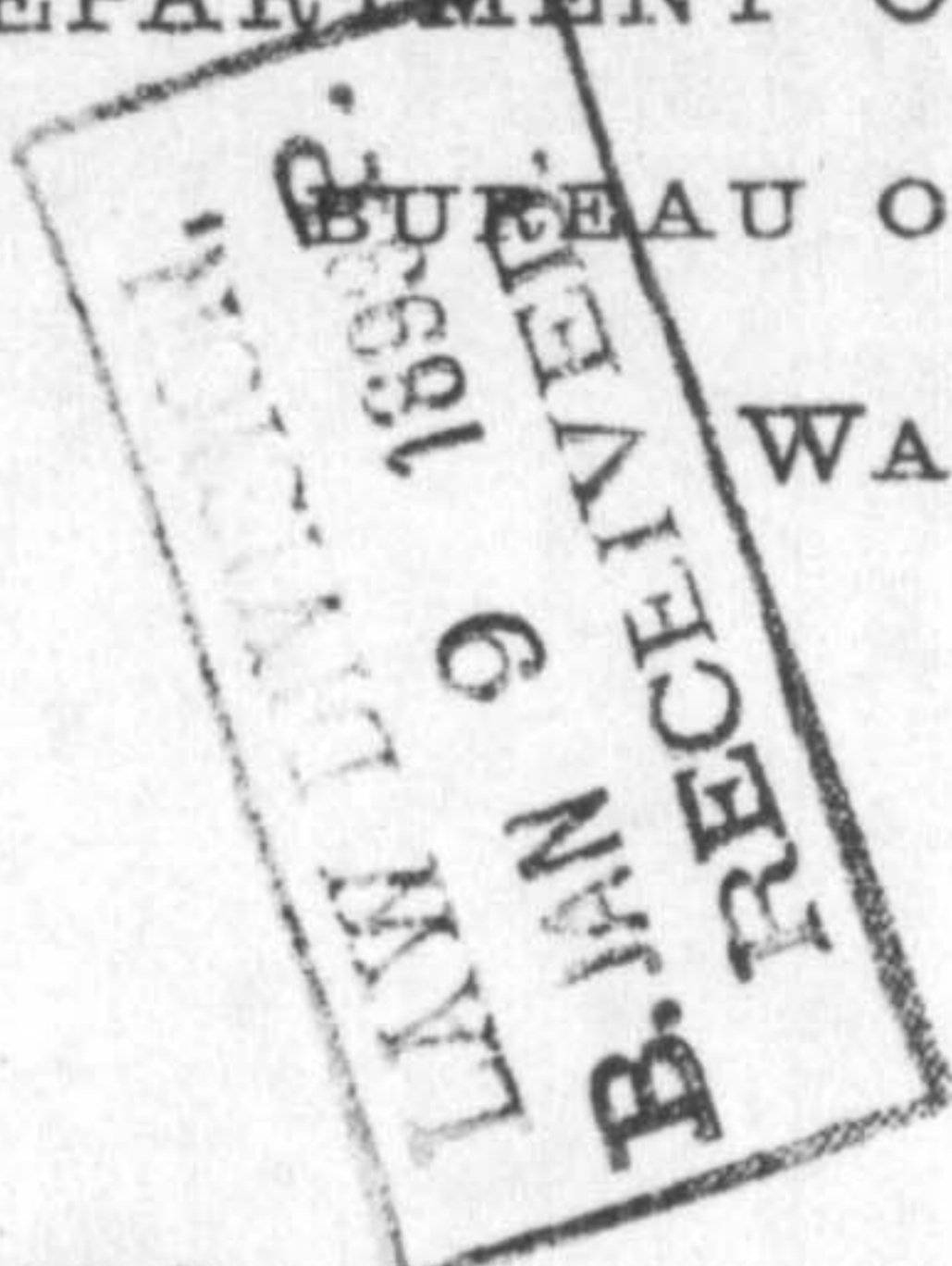

Sir:

Referring to the claim Cert. No. 601,540 Nathan Wyatt Co. "G" 39 U.S.C. Inf. in which you have filed for Jane Wyatt an application to have the pension paid to her as wife of an insane pensioner, and asking for a new certificate, and for increase of pension, you are advised that in order that the pension may be paid to the wife under the Act of Aug. 8, 1882, it is necessary that she file a certified copy of a record of court finding the pensioner insane; a certificate from the Clerk of the Court having probate jurisdiction in the County in which the pensioner has his legal residence showing that no guardian has been appointed; proof of the marriage of the parties; and the affidavits of at least two disinterested credible persons that she is a woman of good moral character, not divorced from the soldier and that she is dependent upon him or upon her own labor for a support.

If a guardian be appointed the pension will be paid to the guardian upon filing certified copies of his letters of
