

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

On this 14th day of November, A. D. 1867, personally appeared before me, a Clerk of the Superior Court in and for the County and State aforesaid, Francis J. Myers aged 21 years, a resident of Baltimore, County of Baltimore, in the State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn, declares that he is the identical Francis Myers who enlisted in the service of the United States at Charles County, in the State of Maryland, on the 31st day of October, 1863, as a Private in Company A, commanded by Lieut. Capt. Thompson, in the 9th Regiment of U. S. G. Troops, in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the 1st day of October, 1865. That while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, on or about the 29th day of September, in the year of our Lord 1864, he received a

wound from the rebels, while engaged in fighting the same, the wound was produced by grape and canister from the Artillery, and was received in the right leg, the bone was broken, and has never been running, and deadening piece of bone, and rendering walking extremely difficult. The wound was received in the charge of Fort Harrison near Richmond Sept 29 1864. He resided in Baltimore since leaving service, has done nothing, because unable to work.

He makes this application for a pension, provided by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862, and hereby appoints William Fowler, Bvt. Maj. and A. A. G., Bureau of Refugees, Freedmen, and Abandoned Lands, or his successor in office, his lawful attorney, and authorizes him to present and prosecute this claim, and to receive and receipt for any orders or certificates that may be issued in satisfaction thereof.
