

29th day of September 1864. They were both engaged, and participated in the Charge before Fort Gilmore Virginia, that said Charge was repulsed, and the 9th Regiment U.S.C.T. to which they - affiants belonged was compelled to fall back, that just before the Regiment and Co. (A) fell back George Covington 1st named affiant saw Francis J Myers declarant limping to the rear. Having been disabled by a wound in the right leg he George Covington seeing blood upon, or near the portion wounded,

Dennis Nutter 2nd named affiant further swears that after he retreated with aforesaid Co, and Regiment from the Charge aforesaid he saw, Francis J Myers - declarant standing with other wounded men, and he, affiant went up and spoke to Francis J. Myers and saw that said Myers was badly wounded in the right leg said wound bleeding,

Affiant further swears that he stooped down and examined aforesaid wound,

Affiant further swears that Francis J. Myers declarant received said wound in the aforesaid charge as they saw him before the charge with Co. B. 9th regt U.S.C.T.

They also swear that they have no interest in the claim of Francis J Myers for Pension
