

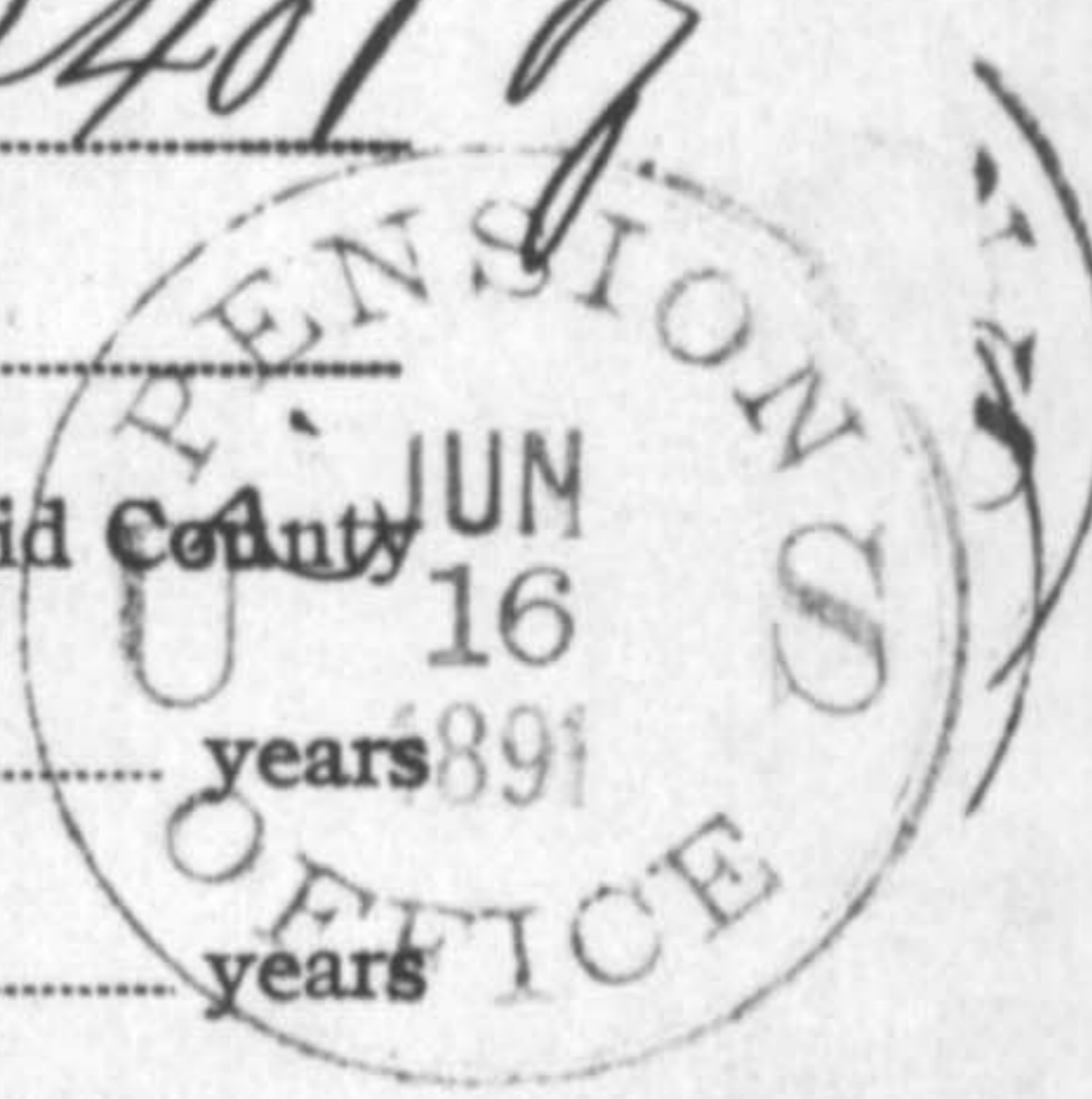
GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

In the matter of Invalia Pension No 722401 of Noah Jackson, Co. G. 4th U.S.C.

Personally came before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for aforesaid County and State, Noah Jackson, aged 48 years

and citizen of the Town of 1504 Mulliken St. Baltimore, State of Maryland



well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

About the latter part of December 1864 at Fortress Monroe, Va and certainly on the 12th Jan'y 1865 whilst on the U.S. Transport vessel with Genl. Terry's troops en-route for capture of Ft. Fisher, N.C. I first felt rheumatism in all of my limbs and difficulty in moving and have not been free from it from that time to the present time.

That I cannot furnish affidavits of commissioned Officers or first sergeant or surgeon or assistant surgeons from the fact that I cannot find them; And as to evidence of physicians who attended me since date of my discharge I beg to state that all of my attending physicians are dead with exception of Dr Geo. H. Taylor whose affidavit is now on file with my case and may the same may be accepted with affidavits on file of Chas. Seymour and William Henry comrades of my company and regiment and the accompanying affidavits of Chas. Stanley and Edward Liggins neighbors and friends who are in addition to know and do know that I am a sufferer from Rheumatism &c.
